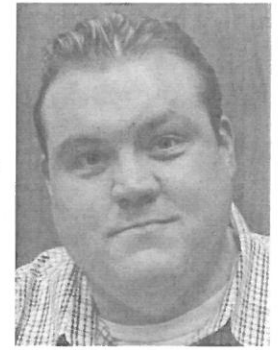

From the President

The month of April is here and spring is now upon us all. An important question that we receive yearly is what I can do with my accumulated yard waste gathered during the winter months? I would like remind everyone of the 2016 Annual Spring Yard Waste Service Begins Monday, April 4. Starting Monday April 4th until Friday April 29th (four weeks) Republic Service, the Contractor for the city's Trash & Recycling Service, will pick up unlimited bags or containers of Yard Waste that is placed next to your Trash & Yard Waste City Cart.

No special bags are required because spring yard waste will be landfilled.

To assist residents with extra yard waste generated while cleaning up their yards in the spring, the city's current Automated Trash Program provides an annual service for unlimited yard waste to be picked up during the first four weeks of April. The yard waste must be properly contained in plastic bags, in tied bundles or loose in containers. No special bags are required because spring yard waste will go to the landfill with regular trash.

The current Trash & Recycling Program only allows for the emptying of one (1) trash cart and one (1) recycling cart per week. The carts are supplied by the city. Extra materials placed outside the carts will not be picked up except during the Annual Spring Yard Waste four (4) week period and the Fall Leaf Pick-up eight (8) week period. Please contact Republic Services at (812) 424-3345 if you have additional questions.

I ask that as we all work toward keeping our neighborhoods clean and tidy while doubling our efforts to share this information with each of our neighbors in order to maximize this program's effectiveness. By all of our members working together and raising awareness of this important service, it will help us to continue to strive toward our stated goals of preserving, enhancing, and promoting the neighborhoods within the City of Evansville!

With busy work, family and volunteer schedules, making an annual screening mammography appointment may not be high on your to-do list. But Deaconess is making it easier for you to access high-quality mammography services when and where you need them.

As the only mobile breast center in Indiana to offer 3D mammography, Deaconess Mobile Breast Center provides this service to women in the places where they work, live and socialize. This service is designed to ensure all women have access to an annual screening mammogram, regardless of your ability to pay or travel to a breast imaging center.

Annual screening mammograms are covered as a preventive screening under most insurance plans. For your convenience, we will file a claim with your insurance provider on your behalf. If you do not have insurance and cannot afford to pay for a

mammogram, you can still receive a screening – thanks to dedicated grants and other fundraising efforts.

The American Cancer Society recommends annual screening mammograms for women when they turn 40, and every year after. By performing most mammograms in 15 minutes or less, we make it easy to fit this life-saving test into your busy day.

If you're not a current Deaconess patient, don't worry. We can easily take care of transferring records of your past mammograms to our office.

Screening Mammograms On The Go



HOW DO I SCHEDULE?

Please call the Deaconess Mobile Breast Center scheduling line at 812-450-MAMM. You will need the following information when calling to schedule your appointment.

- Patient's name and address
- Phone numbers for work and home
- Patient's date of birth (month, day, year)
- Patient's social security number
- Name and address of your physician
- Insurance policy and group numbers
- Information on prior mammogram records

**Our radiologist will use these for comparison purposes*



WHAT DO I BRING TO MY MOBILE MAMMOGRAPHY APPOINTMENT?

- Insurance cards and photo ID must be presented at the time of service.



IS IT POSSIBLE THAT THE MOBILE BREAST CENTER COULD CANCEL?

- Yes - if we don't meet our 20 patient minimum three days before the date of service.
- Yes - if the mammogram coach or equipment needs service.
- Yes - in inclement weather conditions.



HOW WILL I BE NOTIFIED IF THE MOBILE BREAST CENTER CANCELS?

You will be contacted by someone from the Deaconess Mobile Breast Center by phone and rescheduled. When scheduling your appointment, be sure to give the scheduling department your current home, work and cell phone numbers in case of an emergency. Our goal when we cancel is to relocate you to a convenient location or to reschedule the mobile breast center to come back to your facility. If this information is not known when you receive a cancellation notice, you will be contacted again with a make-up date/location.



ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS FOR ANNUAL SCREENING MAMMOGRAMS ON THE MOBILE COACH:

- Must be a woman age 40 or older. A physician referral is not required but you must have a physician for reporting purposes.
- Must be one year since your last mammogram
- Must not be pregnant or breastfeeding
- No new breast lumps or concerns. Patients should promptly contact their physician for evaluation if experiencing breast problems.

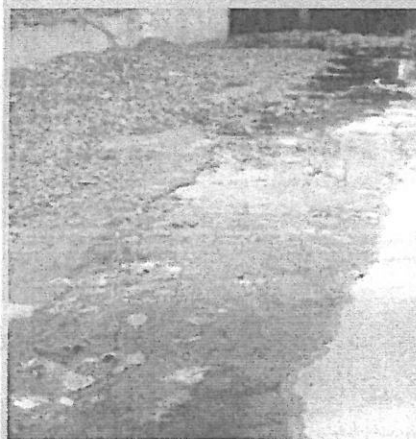
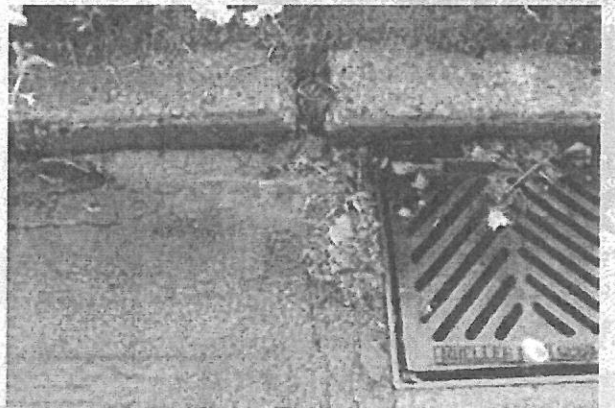
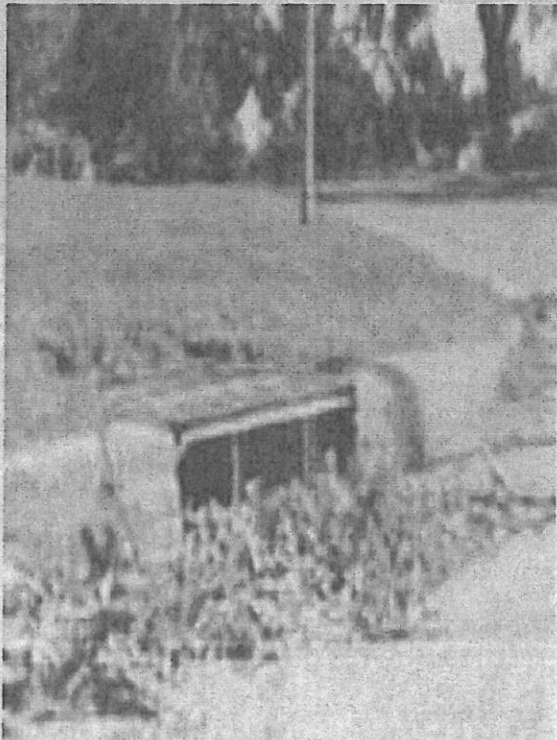
Yard Waste, Leaves and Grass Clippings

It is important to remember that everything we do in our City can have an effect on our environment.

All of the City Streets drain to the Ohio River and therefore everything that goes into the streets and street drains are also going to go to the Ohio River.

The following is a list of suggested practices for yard clean up and routine maintenance:

- ◆ Blow or rake leaves and grass clippings back into your lawn. This adds nutrients to your lawn.
- ◆ Empty mulch bag into a garbage bag and dispose of properly. Do not put in ditches or swales.
- ◆ Use a compost pile or compost barrel.

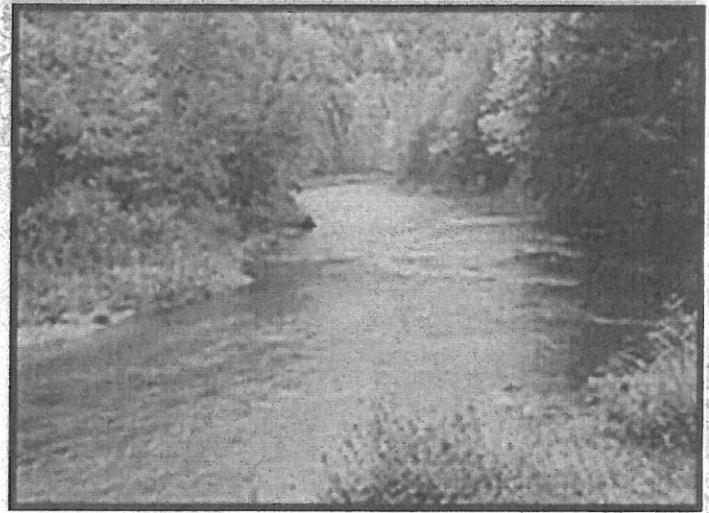
City of Evansville Municipal Code—Illicit Discharge

Illicit Discharge

An illicit Discharge is defined in the City of Evansville Municipal Code as:

*“Any discharge to a municipal separate storm sewer (MS4) conveyance that is not composed entirely of storm water, except naturally occurring floatables, such as leaves or tree limbs that are not deliberately concentrated. Sources of illicit discharges include sanitary wastewater, septic tank effluent, car wash wastewater, oil disposal, radiator flushing disposal, laundry waste water, roadway accident spillage, household hazardous wastes, and **deliberately concentrated yard waste.**”*

The City Engineer’s Office and the Storm Water Coordinator are requesting that Citizens of the City make an effort to comply with this Ordinance by collecting and disposing of grass clippings, leaves, limbs etc. in a proper manner. Blowing or sweeping these materials into the roadway or curb line deliberately is a direct violation. These leaves can be carried down the curb line and into the storm drainage system blocking the flow of storm water leaving the city streets and surrounding property. These materials will also decay and cause the streams and rivers to be contaminated.



Help protect our Rivers and Streams by not placing concentrated yard waste in the curbs and gutters of the streets. They will drain directly into the City Storm System which drains to the Ohio River.

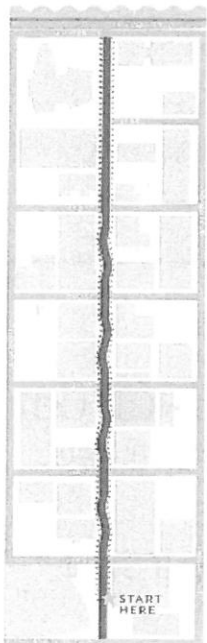
