By-Laws (Condensed)

Artical 1. Neighborhood Association Rules, for membership.

Our meetings are open to the public. unless there's an electec officers meeting which will be helded at a different time or location.

The membership dues are \$12.00 a year for each adult in a household, which amounts to \$1.00 per month.

In order to vote in an election, membership dues must by paid for the year, one must be in good standing with association, should have attended 7 meetings during a calendar year. and reside in the boundries of the Association.

Anyone not living in boundries, but has an invested interest in C.C.I.A. (such as rental property) can hold office as long as they meet the above requirements.

Our elections will be held every (2) years with no term limits, when and if a position becomes open the next individual in line will fill the position, with the bottom position becoming open, will have that position apppointed by President or Vice President. the individual appointed will remain in that position until the next election.

Our meetings will be the 3rd Tuesday of each month, 6:30 p.m. at Mt. Olive Galilee Missionary Baptist Church, located at 825 Line St. with the exceptions of Hoildays, weather or other reason at which time members will be notified.

Dues goes towards stationary for Neighborhood and Snacks

C.C.I.A. is the Flagship for the Coalition Of Inner-city

Neighborhoods, the same as the Westside Improvement Association being that for Westside Neighborhoods.

It has been a policy of this neighborhood to not apply for funding from the city, and will continue to host fundraiser to support our events.

Removing of President or any other office holder:
