July Speaker Highlight

United Neighborhoods of Evansville is pleased to welcome Khrista York, Big Brothers Big Sisters

Big Brothers Big Sisters of Southwestern Indiana is a one-to-one mentoring program dedicated to improving the lives of children in our community. BBBS was established in 1969 and currently serves children in Gibson, Posey, Spencer, Vanderburgh, Warrick, and Henderson, Kentucky. Big Brothers Big Sisters mission is to create and support one-to-one mentoring relationships that ignite the power and promise of youth, and believe that all youth achieve their full potential! Big Brothers Big Sisters believes that every young person deserves not just a seat at the table, but the power to help build it. Through access, belonging, and opportunity, BBBS allows young people that opportunity.

We have two main programs, our community-based and our site-based programming.

- Community-Based, we ask for a minimum of 1 year and meeting two times a month for two hours each. The matches go out into the community and do activities that they enjoy together. We also offer couples matches within our community-based programming, but this match is with a Little Brother.
- Site-Based, we ask for a minimum of a year. The matches meet during the school year at the Little's lunch/recess at a specific site once a week. Under our Site based model we have our High School Bigs program, which operates in Posey, Spencer, and Vanderburgh Counties. Juniors and Seniors have the opportunity to mentor youth in both an elementary and middle school setting once a week.

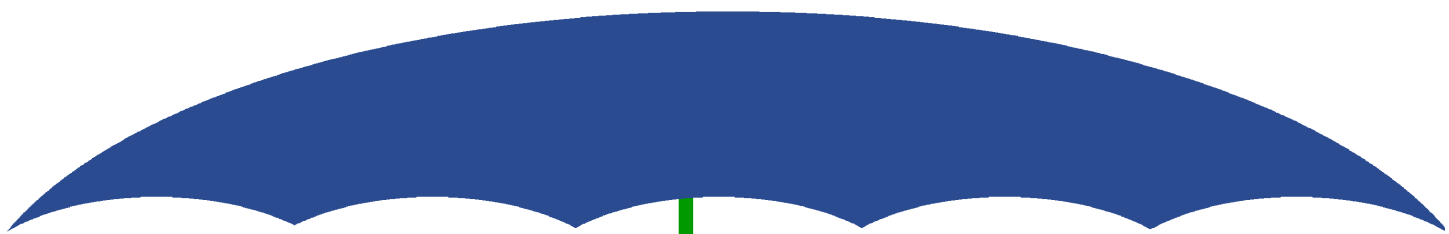

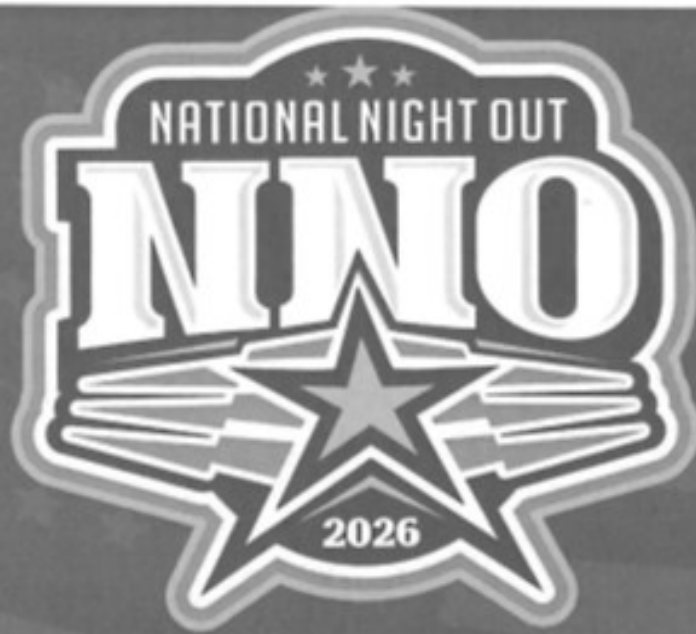
