Spring has to be the most "waited for and welcome season in our Old Historic Neighborhood. It certainly has energized us. Pam is waiting for the Salvation Army due to a cleaning frenzy in her attic. I am running in and out of the house trying to figure out if I should clean inside, plant outside or take a walk. Most days I can be found doing all three. Unfortunately the weather has also brought an increase in crime with break-ins, vandalism to cars and an increase in panhandling in our neighborhood.

The Reitz Home Carriage House had sections of copper guttering taken and we still have two men in the neighborhood calling on the phone and coming to various homes asking for money. Evansville Police Department Corporal, Stephen Greene, in the Courier Saturday, April 25, 2008 "believes neighborhood watches are particularly effective. and reminding us to watch out for each other." "A Neighborhood watch can include but is limited to watching out for our next door neighbor's house if they are away;

being interested in our neighbors' lives with safety in mind and sharing information about crime in our neighborhood." In the 60's and 70's houses were entered if the owner was simply out mowing. (I remember being in the suburbs reading about this in the newspaper!) It is 2008 and unfortunately this situation is happening today, just as it did 35 to 40 years ago. Lock your doors even if you are working in your yard!

It is OEHA's intention to schedule a police officer to attend a meeting and provide us with information pertaining to the current situation. Nick Sandullo is the Police Liaison Officer for our neighborhood. You may contact him at 435-6034, South Sector Police Department. If he is not available messages can be left on his voice mail. Please call him if anyone approaches you or comes to your door requesting money. DO NOT LET THEM IN YOUR HOUSE AND DO NOT GIVE THEM MONEY! As we work together we can help each other making our homes and neighborhoods a unique, beautiful, secure historic area.






