FDP Initiative Phase II Focus Area: Neighborhood Revitalization Tools:

- Create TIF District to capitalize incentive package & infrastructure improvements over time
- Incentive package to attract market rate re-investment:
 - Local lenders:??—below market financing (bank's cost of \$ plus 1 point); fixed rate long-term loans equal to cost of construction vs. appraised value
- CDFI Community Development Financial Organization
- Cash incentives to help overcome appraisal differential
- Interest rate buy downs
- Free/reduced cost property—vacant lots & rehab structures
- Brownfield board continues to buy property--land bank

DMD Project Funding Needs & Potential Funding Sources (Estimates only)

- \$50 Million in loan funds over 5-7 years (local lenders)
- S 3 million in direct incentives for Neighborhood Revitalization/yr
- \$1 million public infrastructure improvements: streets, curbs, gutters, lighting, signage, parks, etc
