

### UNOE WEBSITE WORKSHOP AT AUGUST GENERAL MEETING

I remember Chris Cooke (former President of UNOE) quoting World Hockey champion Wayne Gretzky at a Sparkplug banquet 2 years ago. His quote was, "A good hockey player plays where the puck is. A great hockey player plays where the puck is going to be." And with



that, Chris wanted to steer UNOE to where the puck was going to be. One of Chris's visions was to head up a new Technology Committee and Chairperson for UNOE. That idea of his was voted upon at a UNOE Board meeting and approved. And this is where my tenure as the Technology Chairman began.

As a neighborhood president and a person who works in the field of technology by trade, I was a good fit for the UNOE organization. In the last two years we have done a lot to upgrade our technological deficiencies. For example, last year we built a new *first class* server for the office personnel and neighborhood leaders to use. The server is a shared resource where application programs such as Microsoft Publisher, Word, Excel, Access, and Outlook are installed. Dreamweaver, Photoshop and many other web and media developing tools were also installed. It has plenty of free space and it is in good health. We can all rest assured that our data and documents that are being generated and saved on the server are being backed up every week, month, and year separately. Hoorah!

This year we have rebuilt our website from the ground up. The new website has a backdoor for neighborhood leaders to register and log into. At this upcoming August UNOE General Meeting, I will demonstrate this ability. Come and watch as I register as a new online neighborhood, login and then submit an event to the online calendar in just a few minutes! Watch as I "Suggest a Link" or "Compose an Article" to be published on the new website. There are more bells and whistles to tell you about than the space I have to write about them here. 

At the request of the Mayor's office, the Evansville Police Department would like to publicize the following road closings that will be taking place because of special events. They have asked United Neighborhoods to help by includir them in our newsletter so they can get the word out to the neighborhood associations. Here are the closings for this month and next at newsletter time:


# COMING TO A NEIGHBORHOOD NEAR YOU!

The Evansville Police Department has a new tool to help deal with quality of life issues plaguing most communities, such as loud music, litter, loitering, disorderly conduct, and more generally unsupervised and ill-mannered youth.

An approach is being implemented that will be innovative, economical and effective in combating problem properties that can destabilize an otherwise peaceful neighborhood. The Department needed an obvious presence to confront these problems and was fortunate to obtain an armored truck specially outfitted to become your neighborhood "Guardian." The truck is fortified to protect against tires being flattened and lights from being broken. It is outfitted with a surveillance system and has decals applied stating "Neighborhood Surveillance Unit."

The "Guardian" will be placed in problem locations as determined by police reports, calls-for-service and neighborhood complaints. When a suitable location is identified, the Guardian will be parked in front of the problem property for several days as a very visible message that the police department is aware of the problem and is monitoring those responsible. It is the opposite of an undercover operation. We want the law abiding citizens to know their complaints have not fallen upon deaf ears and we want those causing problems in the neighborhoods to know they are being watched.

While the Evansville Police Department continues to focus on traditional crime, we want our citizens to know we do not underestimate the importance of quality of life problems that can have an extremely negative impact on our neighborhoods if not abated. We realize citizens do care about the noise, the loud music, the litter, the loitering, the disorderly conduct, and the anti-social behavior that can be a disruptive force, destroying the sense of peace and safety. Areas that are most plagued by drug traffic are often the same areas where nuisance behaviors are most prevalent. In communi-



ties that are most affected, it is common to find that the greatest negative influences within the area can be traced to a select few, known problem households or retail businesses.

Evansville's Guardian was modeled off of other successful programs in cities around the nation. The picture shown above is an example of a Neighborhood Surveillance Vehicle. Please join us on August 7<sup>th</sup> at National Night Out to see the unveiling of your "Guardian."

### CAR KEYS BY YOUR BED SIDE

Put your car keys beside your bed at night. If you hear a noise outside your home or someone trying to get in your house, just press the panic button for your car. The alarm will be set off, and the horn will continue to sound until either you turn it off or the car battery dies. This tip came from a neighborhood watch coordinator. Next time you come home for the night and you start to put your keys away, think of this: It's a security alarm system that you probably already have and requires no installation. Test it. It will go off from most everywhere inside your house and will keep honking until your battery runs down or until you reset it with the button on the key fob chain. It works if you park in your driveway or garage. If your car alarm goes off when someone is trying to break into your house, odds are the burglar/rapist won't stick around. After a few seconds all the neighbors will be looking out their windows to see who is out there and sure enough the criminal won't want that. And remember to carry your keys while walking to your car in a parking lot. The alarm can work the same way there. This is something that should really be shared with everyone. Maybe it could save a life or prevent a sexual abuse crime.
