IN MEMORY OF PAUL FARMER

We have lost a strong supporter and past president of UNOE, **Paul Farmer**, who passed on Friday, December 13, 2013 at the age of 77. Paul was very active in helping to form the United Neighborhoods of Evansville in conjunction with United Way of Evansville. He served as President of UNOE during 2004 and 2005, as Treasurer in 2006 and 2007 and Secretary in 2007. He represented UNOE as Neighborhood Associations Services Coordinator and was on the Board of Directors of UNOE for many years. UNOE has become an important community organization now representing 43 neighborhoods. He had also been involved with the Meet Your Legislators program in the past, the Emergency Management Advisory Council, "Destination Home" an effort to end homelessness, Bank on Evansville, along with



many, many more valuable community activities. Paul was also very passionately involved with children as an educator, principal and supporter of many organizations involving children's education and welfare. Our condolences go out to his wife Janice; sons, Terry (Denise) Farmer, Jody Farmer and Kip (Maria) Farmer; 11 grandchildren, and 3 great-grandchildren, nieces and nephews, by whom Paul was further blessed with an especially close relationship. Memorial services were held at11:00 AM Friday, December 20, 2013, at St. Paul's United Church of Christ, German Township.

As we move forward, we will continue in the direction that Paul had set for us. He believed in this community and the value of neighborhoods.

The Service Learning Program at USI invites you to join us in supporting youth work to improve our community on Global Youth Service Day, Saturday, April 12, 2014. A team of Evansville young people have identified neighborhood park clean-up as a critical service they wish to give next spring, and seek your help. You can work with a youth or school group to clean up a park in your neighborhood. A small amount of funding will be available to pay for minor improvements. We will both serve and celebrate with our youth. We hope this will become an annual event that will help us appreciate and harness the great power of youth in our community! Activities will begin on Monday, April 9 and culminate with park cleanup on Saturday, April 12. Celebration with food and neighborhood fellowship will follow after cleanup at various parks (to be determined).

We are in the planning stages of GYSD, so now is the time to get involved! We are recruiting partners and sponsors and ask you to join us. Neighborhood Associations are highly encouraged to participate in this city wide program.

What is Global Youth Service Day?

Global Youth Service Day is an annual campaign that celebrates and mobilizes the millions of children and youth who improve their communities each day of the year through service and service-learning. Established in the United States in 1988, and globally in 2000, Global Youth Service Day is the largest service event in the world, and the only day of service dedicated to children and youth. GYSD is celebrated each year in over **100 countries on 6 continents**.

Evansville celebrated the 25th year of GYSD this past April 27, 2013 with picking up trash in various neighborhoods and then grand finale at the YMCA for food and fun activities.
