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### From the President

What is the job of your Neighborhood Association REPRESENTATIVE?



Neighborhood Association Representatives are the ONLY people who have a right to vote on any item for consideration at the UNOE General meetings.

There was a Bylaw Committee appointed recently, and they reviewed/revisited the current UNOE bylaws. They critiqued and discussed every paragraph in the bylaws. They have made some recommendations to the Board of Directors, which are being taken under advisement. It will be time for the REPRESENTATIVES to vote to accept these Bylaw changes at the UNOE June General Meeting.

Your two REPRESENTATIVES will be the only vote your neighborhood association will get. Do you have two REPRESENTATIVES from your neighborhood association that attend the UNOE General meeting on the 4<sup>th</sup> Thursday of each month.....An officer or anyone in your N/A in good standing can be a representative. Do no pick someone who does not attend the UNOE General Meetings. A REPRESENTATIVE is the one who VOTES on policies that affect everyone in all of the Neighborhood Associations. The REPRESENTATIVE should be one who will vote in a way that represents all of your neighborhood members. Not what they personally want, but what is best for all. These Bylaws are what we live by. It is very important that your REPRESENTATIVE attend all UNOE General meetings. Be sure they are informed and attend in order for your neighborhood vote to count. They should also take back what happened at each monthly General meeting to their neighborhood association meeting.

There are 43 organized neighborhoods which should have two representatives which equal 86 voting people. But would you believe we have had 30 REPRESENTATIVES attend the January 2014 meeting? 19 in February, 22 in March and 19 attended in April. This means that a lot of REPRESENTATIVES have not attended the general meetings.

Your REPRESENTATIVE can be changed up to 24 hours before any meeting in writing. BUT....they must be changed by the close of the day on Wednesday, when the meeting is on Thursday. There are no exceptions to this rule. You will need to send a written notice to the office or send an e-mail by 4 pm on Wednesday before meeting on Thursday. No phone calls, no exceptions.

See your representatives at the next general meeting!




### **DO YOU OWN A PAPER SHREDDER?**



## The Qualities of a Great Street

✓ Attractions & Destinations - Having something to do gives people a reason to come to your area - and return again and again.

Identity & Image - Creating a positive image requires keeping a place clean and wellmaintained.

Amenities - Successful streets provide amenities to support a variety of activities.

✓ Management - An active entity that manages the space is central to a street's success.

✓ Seasonal Strategies - Utilize seasonal strategies, like holiday markets or displays, and recreational activities.

✓ **Traffic, Transit & the Pedestrian** - A successful street is easy to get to and get through; it is visible both from a distance and up close.

 $\checkmark$  **Protects Neighborhoods** - Great streets support the context around them. There should be clear transitions from commercial streets to nearby residential neighborhoods, communicating a change in surroundings with a concomitant change in street character.
