Help Prevent Thefts From Vehicles:

Criminals are always looking for easy targets and vehicle owners invite perpetrators into their vehicles by leaving doors unlocked and windows open. Although it is very difficult to prevent someone from breaking into your vehicle, there are still several things everyone can do. Never leave valuables (purses, wallets, money, electronics, tools, etc...) in your vehicle. If you must leave valuables in your vehicle, lock them in the trunk or use a tamper proof box that can be bolted down and secured. Remove detachable stereos and faceplates every time you leave your vehicle. Park your vehicle in a locked garage when possible or try to park in a lighted area. Finally and most importantly, always lock your doors and window.



To all our United Neighborhood families,

In a letter last year, Officer Krogman and I said this in regards to the passage of the Landlord Registry:

There is more to come... We intend to revisit the Drug House Ordinance in regards to addressing nuisance activities, and how to use it to further curtail how problem tenants destroy the quality of life of others around them. With all the cogs in this crime-prevention wheel working in unison, the people who have Evansville's best interests in mind have a good chance of reclaiming lost ground.

Well, here we are. The changes we envisioned for the Drug House Ordinance have come together to form the *Good Neighbor Ordinance (GNO)*. The point behind this legislation is to address recurring "nuisances" on rental properties, be they crimes (battery, public intoxication, rape, etc.) or municipal code violations (such as trash and abandoned vehicles) via mandated evictions. As of now, while arrests can be made and/or citations issued, there is little that can be done via the City's authority to resolve a problem at a location where the property owner has failed to remove the problem subject(s) from the residence. As such, problems are allowed to persist. And where problems are allowed to stagnate, the quality of life for neighbors (and, potentially, nearby property values) suffers.

The GNO was written in concert with City Council representatives, landlord association members, local attorneys, and law enforcement officers. The goal was to take perspectives from the involved/affected parties and meld them into legislation that offered resolution while observing a process that was sensible and fair. And it was done with you, the citizens of Evansville, in mind. Your welfare. Your best interests. We hope we have your support for the GNO as we move forward.

We ask that any neighborhood association supporting the proposed ordinance do so via a letter expressing that support. *Time is short, so this is an urgent request*. These letters will, in turn, be presented to City Council members the night of the ordinance vote. Let your voice be heard!
