## Candidates Forum at September General Meeting

United Neighborhoods of Evansville will again sponsor a Candidates Forum to let the neighborhoods hear from and ask questions of the candidates in the fall election.

The 16 candidates running the following offices will be participating: Representative in Congress-8th Dist., State Representative-Dist. 76, State Representative-Dist. 77, State Representative-Dist. 78, County Auditor, County Sheriff, County Commissioner 2nd District, and County Council 3rd District.

Each candidate will be given 3 minutes to speak and 4 minutes for Q&A. Candidates that are not in contested races are welcome to attend but will not be given time to speak.

Unfortunately time constraints don't allow us to invite the township candidates. UNOE encourages the neighborhood associations to invite their respective township candidates to their meetings if possible.

# DMD & UNOE Working Together

The Department of Metropolitan Development provides funds from its annual Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) allocation each year for neighborhood development, specifically for neighborhood associations that lie within targeted census tracts in the city of Evansville. These census tracts, clustered around the central city core, encompass a wide geographic area that stretches from Pigeon creek on the west and north, Riverside drive on the south and Highway 41 on the east, with one census tract not included but that is the main area. The neighborhood associations within those areas decided some years ago, that a monthly organizational meeting among the various leaders would be helpful in planning events and in communication with the city. The Focus Council meets on the first Thursday of the month at the YWCA at noon. Our new specialist, Kolbi Gibson, is DMD's representative to both the Focus Council specifically, but the neighborhoods in general. The city of Evansville and the DMD are proud of the things United Neighborhoods of Evansville (UNOE) and the Focus Council together have accomplished, and we look forward to many years of improving the lives of all our neighbors. ## **Back to School Safety:**



School is just around the corner and it is time to start talking to your children about being safe while traveling to school. Whether your child is

walking, riding a bike, or riding a bus, it is important to remember a few safety tips. When walking, Always use a sidewalk. If there is no sidewalk, always walk facing traffic so you can see cars coming. Always cross the street at the intersection. Use crossing guards and pedestrian signals when available and always look both ways before crossing the street. When riding a bike, always wear your helmet. Teach your children the rules of the road, especially stopping at all intersections. When riding the bus,

teach your children the right way to get on and off a bus. Your child needs to stay at least six feet away from the bus while waiting and should not move towards the bus until it has come to a complete stop and the driver has indicated it is O.K. to approach.



Your child should always be able to see the bus driver and the bus driver should always be able to see you child when crossing the street. Finally, travel the route with your children prior to school starting so they will feel comfortable getting to school.

## THREE DISTRICT TOWN HALLS SCHEDULED AUG. 16

INDIANAPOLIS - State Rep. Gail Riecken (D-Evansville) announced she will host three Town Hall meetings throughout her district on **Saturday, August 16.** 

"I wanted to make the Town Hall meetings as convenient as possible, so I've scheduled separate times for three different locations on Saturday, Aug. 16," said Riecken.

"I invite everyone to come and share with me any state government issues they may have, like problems with Medicaid, the Bureau of Motor Vehicles, getting business permits, or concerns with any other state agency.

"I also would like to know if people believe our area residents have had the opportunity to gain sufficient training and skills to compete for good-paying jobs, what obstacles there are to getting new or better jobs, and what experience peo-



ple have had with the Indiana Department of Workforce Development/WorkOne," continued Riecken.

"In addition, I would like to know what local residents think Southwest Indiana can do to better encourage job growth and business investment. Do small businesses need more assistance or state incentives to expand and create additional jobs?

"Concerning education, what are the biggest challenges facing our students today? Are they ready to compete for the good-paying jobs of the future? If not, how can we improve their educational opportunities?" asked Riecken.

"These all are important issues and questions facing our community and state. That is why I need input from my constituents. These Town Hall meetings are for listening, seeking opinions and offering help."
