Red Cross Home Fire Preparedness Campaign

Tragically, our community has a higher than national average of injury and death due to home fires. The American Red Cross is beginning a national project to reduce this loss by 25 percent over the next 5 years.

Volunteers are urgently needed to staff the teams for these dates. The goal to reach all residences will take at least 10 teams of 2 members each for each of the listed sessions. You can work a full or half days on Saturdays or Sunday afternoons. The initial training begins one hour before canvassing at the Red Cross Chapter office on the Lloyd Expressway across from Stockwell Rd.

Canvassing involves: • walking the neighborhoods, •knocking on doors to handout safety information, •asking if the resident would like smoke alarms or batteries installed FOR FREE by a special Red Cross follow up team, and leaving door hangers if no one is home. No canvassing team members will need to enter anyone's home.

Please wear comfortable shoes and dress appropriately for the weather. All volunteers will start at the Red Cross Chapter (29 S. Stockwell Road) to do the training and them we will move to the canvassing area as a group. Local businesses will join Neighborhhod Associations in this outreach effort.

Contact Whitney Nelson at whitney.nelson@redcross.org with the sessions you wish to work. Whitney is an intern in the Red Cross office who will be handling the scheduling. Advance registration is requested. Thank you in advance for your willingness to serve your neighbors and your community.

The City of Evansville has been approved to receive a second round of funding in the amount of \$677,000 rom the Indiana Hardest Hit Fund Blight Elimination 'rogram. The award will be used to acquire and demolsh 31 blighted residential structures. The funding ward is \$635,000, with an additional \$42,000 in naintenance fees to maintain the properties after emolition for up to three years for a total award of 677,000.

The Volunteer Income Tax Assistance Program of the IRS offers free tax return preparation for individuals with low to moderate income.

You may qualify if you have taxable income of up to \$60,000 with dependents.

Appointments are available at the Legal Aid Society on Monday afternoons from 1:00 p.m. to 3:30 p.m. - February 2, 2015 through April 13, 2015. Appointments are made on a first-come, first-serve basis.


