2015 GLOBAL YOUTH SERVICE DAY

Saturday, April 18, 2015

This is the 27th year for Global Youth Service in over 600 countries in the world. This is a family affair. With over 1 million participants with the purpose to clean areas, engage and honor youth for their service. The goal this year is to have 750 people involved in the cleaning of Howell, Garvin and 6 smaller parks and their surrounding areas. You are asked to name up to 6 parks which might need some

time spent on cleaning. Gloves, bottled water and bags will be provided. Volunteers can wipe down playground equipment, clean up trash and whatever else needs to be done. Call UNOE at 812-428-4243 by March 17 if you have a park you want to see someone cleaning in. We also welcome the neighbors and the neighborhood associations. There will be family activities and food between 11am & Noon at Howell Park and Garvin Park. Radio stations will have music, dancing and other family activities. Join us for this cleanup activity and then have some family fun.

Clean Evansville to Help Kick-off the Great American Cleanup

Volunteers will target areas in Ward 6 for the monthly trash pick-up

(Evansville, Ind.) – Clean Evansville will target areas in Ward 6 on Evansville's West Side during the monthly trash pick-up this Saturday, March 7, from 9 to 11 a.m. Teams will gather at locations near Harmony Way and Maryland Street.

Volunteers will be picking up trash and litter near the following locations and surrounding neighborhoods: Helfrich Park Middle School, Tekoppel Elementary School, Mead Johnson Nutritionals, and VFW Post 1114 on North Wabash Avenue. Motorists are asked to drive with caution if they see pedestrians picking up trash along the side of the road.

All teams will meet in the parking lot of the Mesker Park Shelter House, 1545 Mesker Park Drive, to deposit trash collected by the volunteers. Clean Evansville partners with Republic Services to depose of all trash.

In conjunction with this month's clean event, Keep Evansville Beautiful will host its kickoff to the Great American Cleanup. This is an opportunity for organizations and neighborhoods to register for a trash cleanup in 2015. Free supplies for all clean-ups will be provided.

Path to Beauty Gala: Our first annual fundraiser is coming up fast! Join us April 18th at Tropicana for dinner, dancing, drinks and



Don Mattingly & Major League Baseball bringing Youth League to Bellemeade Park

Evansville native, former NY Yankee great, and current LA Dodgers Manager Don Mattingly is establishing a youth baseball and girls softball program targeting Inner City Youth at Bellemeade Park. The Major League sponsored program is called RBI – "Reviving Baseball in Inner Cities". The League will be Directed by Dean Hall a former USAF Chaplain and UE Tennis standout. "Although I received a Tennis scholarship, Baseball was my first and best sport until my junior year in high school. In fact, I batted behind Don in Babe Ruth All Stars when we were 13. Don has always



expressed a desire to see more inner city youth playing Baseball and the timing and program are perfect!"

Don and Dean have been networking and establishing partnerships with other youth organizations like the Boy's and Girl's Club, Carver, YMCA, BoomSquad, and others. The goal is to help each organization establish teams for the League which games will be played at Bellemeade Park and Washington Middle School field this Spring and Summer. Neighborhood Associations are also I invited to either field teams or facilitate neighborhood youth in forming teams.

The Don Mattingly RBI – Evansville league will be for ages 6 to 17 and range from T-Ball, Pitching Machine level, to potential Travel and Tournament Teams. "The great thing is that Major League Baseball is fully behind the effort and desire to help aspiring and talented youth play at the college and potentially professional levels and have a system in place through camps, clinics, and scholarships to help youth develop" says Hall. After school orientations are slated to begin mid April with League play beginning in May. Further details in the next issue.

The training seminar is <u>FREE</u> and open to all rental property owners, managers, assistant managers, landlords and maintenance personal. Lunch will be provide and is free as well. The presentations for the day will include an introduction to the Crime Free Multi-Housing Program, Legal Do's & Don'ts, Meth Suppression Unit, Gang Unit, Narcotics Unit and Crime Prevention Through Environmental Design. Maintenance personnel are encouraged to come to the afternoon session (12-4p.m.) but may also stay for the entire seminar.

Be Street Smart:

Humans are creatures of habits and routines. We go through the same basic routine every day. Our mornings are the same in how we get ready. We take the same route to work each morning. We go to the same location for our workouts. We meet the same people at the same locations for socializing and we get comfortable at malls and shopping centers. Habits and routines can be good, but they can also make us complacent and cause us to lose focus. Criminals take advantage of complacent behavior. Don't be an easy target. It is important to always stay alert no matter what you are doing or where you may be. Pay attention to your surroundings. When you are out, send the message that you are confident and know what you are doing. Trust your instincts. If someone makes you feel uncomfortable, it is probably for a good reason. Know your neighborhoods and alternative routes to work. Be aware of important locations like police stations, fire stations, hospitals, and stores that are open late. If you start to feel uncomfortable, go to a place with lots of people and call 911 if needed. Changing up your habits and routines once in a while will force you to slow down, take your time, and pay attention to what is going. So change it up and try something new. It might turn out to be fun.


