

City to celebrate Arbor Day with Tree Planting at Roberts Park

EVANSVILLE, Ind. – The City of Evansville is planning a community celebration to commemorate Arbor Day with the planting of 200 native species trees at Roberts Park. The planting will take place on April 24, 2015 beginning at 8:00 a.m. The trees are to be planted along the eastern border of Roberts Park and along the western border of the property near Boeke Road.

The trees to be planted are native to Wesselman Woods and the State of Indiana. Local arborist Tom Guggenheim and community volunteer Josh Croll are coordinating the project with city arborist Shawn Dickerson, head of the City of Evansville Urban Forestry Department. Croll suggested the idea for a massive community tree planting on Arbor Day during one of the VOICE visioning session conducted by Leadership Evansville in 2014.

The Evansville Parks Foundation is accepting \$10 donations from community residents interested in sponsoring a tree and help offset planting costs. Corporate donations are also welcome. To donate, contact the Evansville Parks and Recreation Department at 812-435-6161.

Did you know April is "Distracted Driving Awareness Month?" Unfortunately thousands of lives are lost and hundreds of thousands of injuries occur from drivers being distracted by hand held devices and food. Here are a few tips to help keep you safe. Be ready for your trip by eating, checking emails, making calls or texts, and finishing getting ready before you get in your car. Stay focused. Keep your hands on the steering wheel. Refrain from answering your phone. Let passengers handle the phone and control the radio. If you have to make a call or text, pull over in a well-lit area. Even hands free communication can be dangerous because it takes your mind off of the road. Promise yourself you will not text and drive. Talk to your children about the dangers of using a cell phone, especially texting while driving. Don't get in a hurry. It is better to stop and eat. It may take you longer on your trip, but it will give you a chance to unwind, stretch, and relax for a few minutes before continuing. Never try to read the paper or a book while driving. Trying to watch a video or a movie is just as bad. Don't become a statistic. Be safe and stay - Lt. Monty Guenin, EPD alert.


