Time for cleanouts, getting rid of items not wanted or usable to us anymore? Here is some important information on RECY-CLING.

Can you guess what is the most recycled item? If you guessed aluminum cans (soda & beer cans) and milk/water jugs, you guessed correct.

Can you guess what item is put in recycle container that <u>does</u> <u>not belong</u> in recycle container? If you guessed pizza boxes and Styrofoam, you are right again.



All plastic with 1 to 7 recycle symbol listed on item.

All aluminum, steel or bio-metal

Cans/lids/caps (clean plastic & aluminum)

Cardboard-corrugated (cut to 2 ft x 2 ft maximum)

Beverage/cereal boxes (breakdown, you can get more in the container)

Paper/newspaper/magazines/junk mail/ envelopes/catalogues/office paper

MAKE SURE ALL BOTTLES AND CANS ARE RINSED OUT AND/OR CLEAN.

### NON- ACCCEPTABLE ITEMS FOR RECYCLE:

Yard waste (flower pots, garden plastic, tree trunks, ball roots) (limbs over 2" dia x 4 ft long)

Food waste, (Styrofoam containers, drinking glasses, juice containers, Styrofoam plates)

Tissue products/paper towels, Wax paper containers, juice/food containers

Pizza boxes (carryout), food wrappers/Styrofoam food carry boxes

Light bulbs, Ceramic items, drinking glasses, & crystal

Scrap metal, aluminum foil, pie pans

Pesticide cans, aerosol cans of any type

Medical supplies

Cat litter

### The Great Central U.S. ShakeOut

Annual Multi-State Earthquake Drill

### Neighborhoods

At 10:15 a.m. on October 15, 2015, millions of people will "Drop, Cover, and Hold On" in The Great Central U.S. ShakeOut, the region's largest earthquake drill ever! All neighborhood groups are encouraged to participate in the drill (or plan a more extensive exercise)

Major earthquakes may happen anywhere you live, work, or travel. The ShakeOut is our chance to practice how to protect ourselves, and for everyone to become prepared. The goal is to prevent a major earthquake from becoming a catastrophe for you, your organization, and your community.

Why is a "Drop, Cover, and Hold On" drill important? To respond quickly you must practice often. You may only have seconds to protect yourself in an earthquake before strong shaking knocks you down, or something falls on you.



Millions of people worldwide have participated in Great ShakeOut Earthquake Drills since 2008. The Great Central U.S. ShakeOut is now held on the third Thursday of October each year

### **Protect Your Newborn:**


Are you getting ready to be a parent or a grandparent? If yes, what a wonderful experience you will have whether this is your first bundle of joy or you are on number two, three, four or more. Even if you are an experienced parent, there are several safety tips to keep in mind. One of the most important safety tips to remember starts when you get ready to go home from the hospital. Check your car seat to make sure it has been properly installed because they are all a little different. You can find videos on line for proper instructions and read your manual.

Avoid placing your baby on high surfaces like kitchen islands. Babies can't crawl, but they seem to wiggle and scoot everywhere. Watch those pets. They can be a little curious and even jealous at times. Take a CPR and choking training course. This will not only possible save your baby's life, but



you just might save the life of someone else. I am not an advocate of co-sleeping with your baby, but many parents do. If you choose to cosleep, research how to do it safely. Learn how to properly give your baby a bath. That little one can slip right out of your hands. You won't have to worry about it right away, but your baby will be crawling all over the house before you know it. Get down and crawl around before your baby arrives and child proof those hazards like light sockets and sharp corners. Remember, it is O.K. to be nervous. Relax and enjoy the greatest miracle of all.
