## TIPS IF YOUR HOME IS BURGLARIZED

There are many things home owners can do to deter a burglary from picking their house to victimize. Make sure your doors and windows are locked, outside lighting, alarm signs and other techniques, but what should you do if a burglar enters your home while you and your family are there? Typically, a burglar does not want a confrontation. That is why they try to pick times when people are not home. Talk to your family about places to hide if they hear strange noises. Many times a loud noise or turning on a light will cause a burglar to flee. Regardless, the most important thing is to stay calm. After being awoken from a

deep sleep, it is natural to be a little hazy and say something like "Who's there?" You may get a response or hear footsteps leaving

your home. Don't investigate where the noise is coming from. You might startle a burglar which could lead to an unwanted physical confronta-

tion. Get to your phone and immediately dial 911. Find a place to hide and stay there until police arrive. Avoid confrontation in possible. Remember, life is precious, property is not. If you are confronted, leave your phone on so the call taker can hear what is going on. Give the burglar what he/she wants. If you have to defend yourself, do everything you can to survive.

## Beyond the call of duty -

On Saturday I had ridden my electric mobility scooter up on North Main Street. It was acting odd and on the way home it quit entirely at the Civic Center parking lot area. Some one was coming to get me but not the scooter. Lt. The Volunteer Income Tax Assistance Program of the IRS offers free tax return preparation for individuals with low to moderate income.

- Social Security Card for each adult and child
- All Wage and Earnings Statements (W-2s, 1099, etc.)
- List of Itemized Expenses for Self-Employed Individuals
- Social Security Benefit Statements
- **Unemployment Statements**
- All Health Insurance Information for all family members
- All Interest and/or Dividend Statements
- Last Year's State and Federal Tax Returns
- Proof of Real Estate Taxes Paid
- Landlord's Name & Address and the Total Amount Rent Paid
- Child Care Provider's Name/Address/SSN/TIN# & Total Amount Paid
- Proof of Educational Expenses, including student loan information

Interns will spend at least 50 percent of their time on a predetermined project that enhances collegelevel skills and abilities.


This program provides interns the opportunity to work with state agency officials, as well as participate in a Speaker Series which features various elected officials, state agency directors and other government representatives.


