The 2017 Sparkplug Committee has been hard at work already planning the best yet Annual Sparkplug Recognition Banquet. The Banquet will be held Thursday October 26th at the Tropicana Conference Center in the Walnut Rooms. Some of the changes coming:

- A change in the way the Sparkplug Awards will be given. The recognition will be read from the podium so all can hear clearly, but the awards to each
  Sparkplug will be given at the tables.
- A special recognition for our Community Police Officers. But with that, CPOs will not be allowed to be Sparkplug winners unless they actually live in 
  the neighborhood giving the award.
- The cost per ticket has been the same since 2014. UNOE has tried to keep the cost down and supplement the cost of the meal tickets. This year the decision was made to raise the price of the tickets to \$18.00 since the overall price of everything is going up. This is still half of the cost with UNOE supplementing the other half through sponsorships.
- The cost of ads have changed. The cost of a business card for the Neighborhood Associations ONLY will be \$25.00. All other business card ads will be \$50.00. Other size ads will still be available.

#### The Regional Neighborhood Network Conference 2017 - UPDATE

Last month, Mayor Lloyd Winnecke, the DMD and United Neighborhoods of Evansville made the official announcement of the Regional Neighborhood Network Conference coming to Evansville. We are now full speed ahead with the conference planning. We have secured the ONB Events Plaza ballroom and conference rooms. We have reserved nearly 200 rooms at the DoubleTree and 50 rooms at the Tropicana. We have nearly completed our RNNC swag bag items...which is a really big to-do item off of our plate. Thanks to all of those who were on the Swag Bag committee!

Starting this month, we will be making some of our final decisions on workshops, on the conference itinerary, and on the count of the volunteers that we will need. We have received over 30 workshop proposals and we are going to be forced to choose which ones will be selected for our conference. This is a good situation to be in. I want to apologize in advance to anyone or group that is not selected to be in our conference. These are hard decisions to make and none of it is taken lightly.

#### Summer Safety Tips from the Evansville Fire Department

#### Beat the Heat:

Whether you're working or playing outside in the summer, anybody not accustomed to the heat is at risk for a heat-related illness. Take steps to protect yourself:

- $\checkmark$  Wear appropriate clothing, including a wide-brimmed hat
- $\checkmark$  Take frequent water breaks
- $\checkmark$  Apply sunscreen with an SPF of at least 15
- $\checkmark$  Never leave kids or pets unattended in a vehicle

#### Water Safety

More than one in five drowning victims are children 14-years-old and younger, and most incidents happen when a child falls into a pool or is left alone in the bathtub. Keep your kids safe in the water:

 $\checkmark$  Find age-appropriate swim lessons for your child, but keep in mind that lessons do not make your child "drown-proof"

- $\checkmark$  Don't rely on lifeguards to watch over your children
- $\checkmark$  Never leave your child unattended


A celebratory Ice Cream Social Event will be held on Saturday, June 24, 11am-4pm at the shelter. It is open & free to the public.
